He completed his B.A. at Seoul National University, Korea and also served as Visiting Fellow to the Business School of Columbia University in New York City. And he was Research Fellow at the Sejong Institute, Korea.

Vyacheslav Ivanovich SHPORT

Governor of the Khabarovsk Krai

Dr. Vyacheslav I. SHPORT was born on June 16, 1954 in Komsomolsk-on-Amur. He graduated from the technical school majoring in aircraft engineering and started his career at the Komsomolsk-on-Amur Aviation Manufacturing Enterprise named after Y.A.Gagarin (KnAAPO), where he worked up his career to the technical director. In off-work hours he studied in Komsomolsk-on-Amur Polytechnic Institute, and graduated with honours in Aircraft Engineering.

He initiated and supervised two military conversion programs at KnAAPO: assembling of Be-103 ("Amphibia") and Su-80 regional jet for 30 passengers.

He served as a member of the State Duma of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation; Deputy-Chairman of the Committee of the State Duma for Industry, Construction and High Technologies; Chairman of the Expert Council for Technical Upgrading of Russia's Industry; Chairman of Interfractional Association "Aviation and Aerospace" in 1999-2007.

He was the Head of the Expert Council for Aviation and Aerospace in 1999-2003 and received second university degree in Law in 2003. He was the Director of the Directorate for Production and Technical Development of the SUKHOI Aviation Holding from January 2008 to February 2009. In March 2009, he was appointed Deputy-Chairman of the Khabarovsk Krai Government – Minister for Industry, Transport and Communications of the Khabarovsk Krai.

Since May 2009, he has been Governor of the Khabarovsk Krai (On April 30, 2009 appointed acting Governor of Khabarovsk Krai by the President of the Russian Federation; on May 6, 2009 invested with powers of the Governor by the Khabarovsk Krai Duma; on April 30, 2013 appointed acting Governor of Khabarovsk Krai by the President of the Russian Federation; on September 8, 2013 elected by vote Governor of Khabarovsk Krai). In addition, he is an author of 10 patents.

Chung Tae-ik
Chairman of the Korean Council on Foreign Relations (KCFR)

Mr. Chung Tae-ik graduated from Seoul National University with a B.A. in Law and earned his M.A. in Law from Seoul National University as well as a diploma from Amsterdam University, Netherlands. He passed the 2nd foreign service exam and served in various key posts, including Head of American Affairs Bureau, Korean Ambassador to Russia, Egypt, and Italy as a Diplomat, President of the Institute of Foreign Affairs & National Security, and the Senior Presidential Secretary for Foreign Affairs and National Security. After retiring from public life, he served

as the Joint Representative at the Peace Asia, President of Board of Directors at the Korea National Oil Corporation, and Chair-Professor at the Dankook University. He is also an honorary member of the Russia Lev Nikolaevich Tolstoi Association and Korean representative of the Bering Strait Tunnel Forum.

His academic papers include "Russia, Northeast Asia, and Korea," "New development plan of the relation between Korea and Russia," and "New Northeast Asian order and relations between Korea and Russia."

Founding Member of R20 Regions of Climate Action in 2010, together with Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, Ms. Michèle Sabban was appointed President in March 2012. The R20 helps states, provinces, regions, and other subnational governments around the world to develop, implement, and communicate low-carbon and climate-resilient economic development projects, policies, and best practices.

Ms. Michèle Sabban was Vice-President of the Regional Council of Ile-de-France – in charge of general administration, staff and procurement contracts from March

1998. Since the beginning of her term, she has worked on strengthening ties and cooperation between Ile-de-France and European Institutions.

She was elected President of the Assembly of European Regions (AER) to the General Assembly in Tampere (Finland) from November 2008 to May 2013. Since May 2013, she is President of Fonds Mondial des Villes (FMDV) and President of the interregional exchange program for young people, *Eurodyssey*, launched in 1985 by Edgar Faure, at that time President of the Franche-Comté Regional Council.

Since founding of Huaxin Group in 1992, the Huaxin became a global enterprise with 20 subsidiary companies in Russia, China, and Mongolia, etc. in a variety of fields such as Russia special zone of agriculture, special zone of industry, real estate, and trade after having 20 years difficult time.

With an outstanding investment knowledge and creative management spirit to think of the person, the company contributes greatly to local economies creating 1,500 jobs along with developing local economic development.

As part of economic and trade cooperation

and exchange between China and Russia, the company performs its works in a variety of projects in agriculture, real estate, and trade and achieves substantial results.

Mr. Mitsuhiro Mimura is a Senior Research Fellow and Director of Research Division at ERINA (Economic Research Institute for Northeast Asia) in Niigata, Japan. He received Ph. D. in Jurisprudence from Graduate School of Law, Osaka University, Japan in 2001. Upon graduation he has been making a research at ERINA. His area of study includes North Korean economy, North Korean law, and Inter-Korean relationship and Northeast Asian economic integration. Since 1996, he has visited North Korea more than twenty-eight (28) times.

He often visits various cities in Northeast Asia, including Pyongyang for academic exchange. He is one of the rare Japanese scholars who are able to exchange thoughts directly with North Korean scholars in Pyongyang. Supported by colleagues in both Koreas, China, Russia, the U.S., the E.U. and Japan, his research has deep insight into how Northeast Asia and widely accepted in Northeast Asian countries, including North Korea. Based on his unique experience, he advocates a new perspective of integrated North East Asian economy.

Cho Yong-sung
Professor of Department of Food & Resource Economics, Korea University

Dr. Yongsung Cho is a professor of Department of Food & Resource Economics, Korea University, and received his Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota at St. Paul. He has been appointed as an adjunct professor in the Green School of Korea University and KIST, and also had been served as a vice president for development and external affairs, Korea University. He was a research fellow at the Korea Energy Economics Institute. He has been teaching the areas related to environmental economics, while conducting research on the areas of climate change and energy

resources. In particular, his research focus lies in energy mix (esp. nuclear power and renewable energy), GHG emission trading, climate change adaptation, and GHG abatement negotiation. He has been also directing, coordinating, or participating in various research projects in developing modeling through statistical analysis such as estimating the ancillary benefit of GHG reduction. Currently, he is running a 10-year project that specializes in a graduate school program of climate change, which has been supported by the Korean Ministry of Environment since 2007.
